



Sail Training Ship NIPPON MARU

National Important Cultural Property

Sail Training Ship NIPPON MARU was built in 1930 as a training ship for cadets. The ship brought up 11,500 cadets for 54 years until her retirement as a training ship in 1984. During her service, NIPPON MARU logged 45.4 times around the earth (1,830,000 kilometers in total). The ship was placed under the authority of the City of Yokohama in 1984 and has been open to the public since 1985.

NIPPON MARU is also used for a full-sail exhibit in cooperation with volunteers and provides marine educational programs to students.



Sail Training Ship NIPPON MARU and Yokohama Port Museum are located in Nippon Maru Memorial Park of the Minato Mirai 21 District.

The Park was converted from the dockyard into a waterfront park by the City of Yokohama in 1985.

Yokohama Port Museum

Yokohama Port Museum is the first museum featuring the Port of Yokohama.

In April 2009, the Museum was totally remodeled from Yokohama Maritime Museum (opened in 1989) by the 150th Anniversary of the Port Opening Commemorative Project. Under the theme of "Port of Yokohama in history and life", the exhibits focus on the history, operation and role of the Port of Yokohama.

The Museum also provides special exhibitions, lectures, tours and craft classes.

In the spring of 2018, "Yanagihara Ryohei Art Museum" opened for permanent exhibitions.

- Special exhibitions may require a separate admission fee.

Sail Training Ship NIPPON MARU: Visitors in wheelchair and with assistance dogs are only available for the long poop deck because of the ship's structure.


For visitors with small children

Sail Training Ship NIPPON MARU



You can see inside the ship and will learn about the living history and sea training of NIPPON MARU with photos, rooms and equipment of the crew at the time when they sailed across the ocean.

① Time bell

The bell was struck every half-hour by the watch on duty. Each watch would take its turn at eight bells.



② Belaying pins

All the ropes for manipulating sails are secured to the bars called "belaying pins".



③ Cadet's room

Although the room is too small to accommodate 8 persons, it is a cozy place for cadets to relax.



④ Diesel engines

There are large-sized diesel engines that boast an incomparable track record and was the first of its type made in Japan.



⑤ Captain's day room

The room is used to receive visitors and listen to the reports from officers.



⑥ Steering wheel

The steering wheel is used for controlling the ship in accordance with the condition of the sails, so that it is located at the end of the ship.

⑨ Lawn square

Why don't you relax on the open green lawns? The square is located on the rooftop of Yokohama Port Museum.



① Yokohama Dock Company, Ltd. Air compressor

1918 Manufactured by Chicago Pneumatic Tool Company (U.S.A.) Introduced in the time of Taisho Period (1912-1926) when Yokohama Dock Company, Ltd. entered into the shipbuilding business.



② Topgallant mast from Sail Training Ship NIPPON MARU

The upper section of the main mast made of hinoki cypress. It was used for 40 years since ship refit in 1952.



③ Screw propeller from Sail Training Ship NIPPON MARU

1929 Kawasaki Shipbuilding Corporation (Kobe)

* It may be closed temporarily on some occasions.



④ Yokohama Dock Company, Ltd. No.1 Dock

Constructed in 1898. It is a dry dock for ship repair and had been used until 1982. Important Cultural Property designated by the National Government.



⑤ Literary monument to writer Shin Hasegawa

Shin Hasegawa(1844-1963) was born in Yokohama and worked as an errand boy at the Dock No.2 construction site in his boyhood.



⑥ Yokohama Dock Company, Ltd. Drainage pump cover for No.1 and No.2 Docks

1896 Manufactured by W.H.Allen, Son & CO, Ltd (England) Introduced for the time of the foundation of the dockyard (founded in 1899) and used for nearly 85 years.

⑦ Foundation Stone for Minato Mirai 21 Project




The foundation stone which had been anchored in the sea at the cornerstone-laying ceremony to pray for the safety of construction and commemorate the start of the construction in 1984 was later reclaimed and placed here.

⑨ Training center

Available for meetings and seminars. (Advance reservations and payment are required.)

Permanent Exhibits consist of two zones; "Port of Yokohama History Zone" and "Port of Yokohama Rediscover Zone". The History Zone looks back at the seven periods of the 150 years of the Port's history and the Rediscovery Zone explores the system and role of the Port through different themes such as Port Construction, Harbor Transportation, Marine Transport and Living & Environment. The Museum also has an extensive maritime reference library.

② Screw pile used for Osanbashi



A cast iron screw pile that supported Osanbashi Pier for nearly a hundred years since 1894.

② Osanbashi Pier



Osanbashi Pier in 1897-1907. The first pier constructed in the Port of Yokohama.



The folding fan with autographs of Babe Ruth and other American baseball players who visited Japan on passenger ship in 1934. It was given to a Yokohama quarantine officer.

③ Cargo-passenger ship ARGENTINA MARU model

1939 A typical cargo-passenger ship on the South America and Around-the-World routes before WWII.



⑤ Crude oil tanker TOKYO MARU model

1966 Large tanker that was constructed in Yokohama during the rapid economic growth period.
